### STRATEGIES

- Ergonomics
  - Set up your work station while considering height, light, the seat position, your feet, and remember to take breaks!
- Use Hot Keys
  - Pressing keys is less stressful than moving a mouse or trackpad
  - You will make fewer mistakes





## AUTOMATION

- Can be influenced by new technologies (as in Ford's mass production of the Model T or the popularization of the ATM)
- Can influence artists and writers.
  - For instance automatic writing as "stream of consciousness" (Virginia Woolf) or when the writer "channels" spirits (Arthur Conan Doyle)
- Relates to rule-based writing or rule-based conceptual art, wherein the artifact is created "automatically," by following a set of rules.

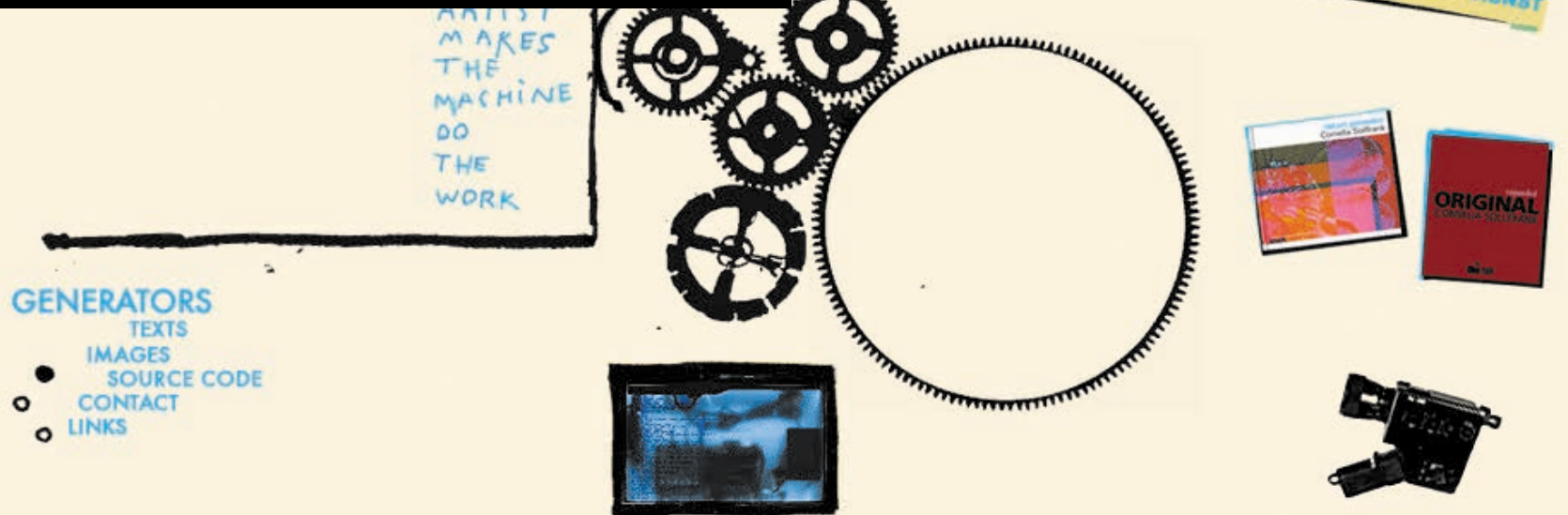

## AUTOMATION

- Refers to mechanical processes that hint at artificial intelligence
- Also suggests generative art, created by some automatic or rule-driven process.
  - For this type of work, a theme and “ground rules” are established
  - Then the work is formed while it evolves and mutates based on the system inherent to the process
